The Town Administrator, Chief Financial Officer and/or Assistant Treasurer are empowered to invest cash funds as bank balances will allow from time to time in order to realize a revenue. The above stated officers are authorized to transfer funds electronically for the purpose of investments and payroll only. The following are authorized as suitable investments:

- Interest-bearing bank accounts in banks as authorized above for deposit of local unit funds (GUDPA approved).
- Certificates of deposit in GUDPA approved banking institutions.
- Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America. This includes instruments such as Treasury Bills, Notes and Bonds.
- Government money market mutual funds that comply with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.1(e).
- Any federal agency or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days from the date of purchase, and has a fixed rat of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- Bonds or other obligations of the local unit or school district of which the Town is a part.
- Any other obligations with maturities not exceeding 397 days, as permitted by the State Division of Investments
- Local government investment pools which comply with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.1 (e) and conditions set by the Division of Local Government Services.
- New Jersey Cash Management Fund.
- Repurchase agreements (repos) of fully collateralized securities which comply with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-15.1(e).
- New Jersey Asset & Rebate Management Program.
- New Jersey CLASS

There are no approved security broker/dealers. In the event that a security broker/dealer should be approved during the year, the registered principal of said brokerage firms approved shall be provided with and sign an acknowledgement that they have seen and reviewed the cash management plan.

Each month, the chief Financial Officer shall prepare a report for the Administrator that consists of the following in accordance with NJSA 40A:5-15.2:

- A summary of all investment made or redeemed for the month.
- A listing of any and all financial institutions holding local unit funds.
- The class or type of securities purchased or funds deposited.
- Income earned on deposits and investments.
- Market value of investments and disclosure as to how the value was determined, if applicable.
- A listing of accounts or deposits that do not earn interest.

This document shall constitute the cash management policy of the Township of Long Beach.

Any official involved with the selection of depositories, investments, broker/dealers shall disclose any material business or personal relationship to the Manager and to the Local Finance Board of Local Ethics Board as applicable. Any official who, in the course of his or her duties, deposits or invests in accordance this plan shall be relieved of any liability for loss.

## A RESOLUTON OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING THE FEES TO BE PAID PURSUANT TO §5-8A(7)(d) OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH

**WHEREAS,** §5-8A(7) of the Code of the Township of Long Beach, New Jersey provides for the employment of police officers in an off-duty capacity; and

**WHEREAS**, subsection (d) requires the Board of Commissioners of the Township to fix by Resolution the pay which off-duty police officers are to receive.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Long Beach, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey at a regular meeting held Friday, January 4, 2008:

A. The hourly rate for employment of off-duty police officers by any person or entity desiring to retain the services of police officers of the Township of Long Beach for off-duty activation shall be the rate paid to police officers of the municipality in which the police officers are employed;

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT SUCH PAY SHALL NOT BE LESS THAN SIXTY DOLLARS (\$60.00) PER HOUR WITH A MINIMUM OF FOUR (4) HOURS PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF §5-8A(7) OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LONG BEACH, NEW JERSEY.

- B. Any person or entity desiring to retain the services of police officers of the Township of Long Beach for off-duty activation shall pay an administrative fee of twenty percent (20%) (of total hours worked by off-duty police officers).
- C. When a police vehicle is required to be utilized during the employment of off-duty police officers, the fee shall be Forty Dollars (\$40.00) for four (4) hours or less with a maximum fee of Eighty Dollars (\$80.00) for use in excess of four (4) hours.
- D. This resolution shall supersede all prior resolutions fixing fees to be charged for off-duty police employment and be retroactive to January 1, 2008.
